Donna Seto Young's Legacy

Darwin College received a legacy gift from the estate of the late Professor Donna Seto-Young (PhD 1976–79). Following Donna's wishes, the College was able to immediately establish a studentship in the biological sciences in honour of her supervisor, the late Professor David Ellar. There have now been two students awarded. The first awardee was Alyce McClellan, who is now a Research Fellow in Structural & Molecular Biology at UCL. Dr McClellan says, *"I'm deeply grateful to have received the David Ellar Award at the start of my PhD. Coming into academia via a less traditional path – working first as a researcher in a charity – the recognition gave me real confidence in my new environment. It has since helped me secure my current postdoctoral position at UCL, and enabled BBSRC funds to support the positive experience of more students' at Cambridge."*
